What is the current situation of European women in the workforce?	Is there a correlation between the duration of a peace agreement and the presence of women representative at the negotiation table?	During the last decades, much progress has been made in terms of women empowerment, especially regarding their work accessibility: the EU average of women involved into the workforce is now around 60%, with the aim of reaching 75% by 2020.	Yes, peace agreements are 30 per cent more likely to last when women are meaningfully represented during negotiations.
When has Saudi Arabia lifted the driving ban for women?	Which are the rates of female and male members of the International Olympic Committee Executive Board?	24 June 2018. Saudi Arabia was the only country in the world to forbid women to drive.	26,7% Women; 73,3% Men (2015).
Is there any digital gender gap?	What is the amount of women graduated in STEM subjects?	Yes, there are roughly 250 million fewer women online than men.	The number of women graduating in core STEM subjects has grown from 22,020 in 2015/2016 to 22 340 in 2016/2017. However, due to more rapid growth in the number of men graduating in these subject areas, the percentage of graduates who are women has dropped from 25% to 24%.

Who was the first woman to win a Nobel Prize?	How much has Africa to wait to achieve gender equality in the workplace?	Marie Curie, Nobel Prize in Physics, 1903	80 years.
Is there a correlation between child mortality and women education?	Which are the rates of illiterate women and men in the world?	Yes, A study using data from 219 countries from 1970 to 2009 found that, for every one additional year of education for women of reproductive age, child mortality decreased by 9.5 per cent. (UN Women)	Women make up more than two-thirds of the world's 796 million illiterate people. (UN Women.)
